Ine Svety (Other Worlds) is a poignant documentary focusing on the northeast corner of Slovakia traditionally known as Saris. Multiculturalism has been a way of life in this territory of the Carpathian Mountains for more than 700 years. The film highlights members of Saris' four primary ethnic groups -- Carpatho-Rusyns, Slovaks, Romany (Gypsies) and Jews -- by focusing on one individual from each community telling their story. It's a true-to-life film about the joys, sorrows and challenges of these inhabitants today -- four groups who have lived peacefully with one another for centuries.
