Annual Meeting Recap - Accomplishments in 2017/Goals for 2018

The C-RS Annual National Meeting took place on Sunday, October 29th at the Cultural Center in Munhall. Twenty members attended the meeting in person and fifteen participated via the GoToMeeting webinar.

For those of you who were unable to attend the meeting, we had a productive 2017. A few of our accomplishments include:

- **Establishing a realistic, approved budget** - We began the New Year 2017 by approving a C-RS budget for 2017-2018. This has been a large undertaking. Thanks to Tim Felegie, Rich Laychock and Tom Maley, who reconciled the past several year's finances, we finally have a budget.
- **Holding a Strategic Planning Meeting** - A meeting involving Chapter leadership and the C-RS Board of Directors is scheduled for Spring 2018.
- **Renovation of the Cultural Center** - We installed 10 new Pella windows, repaired the roof, and repaired and painted the exterior woodwork of the Center. We are profoundly grateful to you for your generous donations in response to our appeal letter last November. A very special thank you to Dr. Robert Hanich and the GCU for their generous donation.
- **Giving a scholarship to a Penn State student.** Thanks to Dr. Paula Donson, who donated \$5,000 to provide financial assistance to an outstanding student in our C-RS community attending Pennsylvania State University.
- **Providing care-packages for college-bound students.** This project was conceived by Laurel Tombazzi's daughter and we are grateful to her for this brilliant idea. Bettianne Diles and her daughter Veronica are overseeing this project.

- Continuing with the renovation of our Cultural Center

Michael Strank (Nov. 1919 - March 1, 1945) was a United States Marine Corps Sergeant of Carpatho-Rusyn decent born in Jarabina, Slovakia and raised in Johnstown, PA area. He was killed in action during the battle of Iwo Jima in World War II. He is best known for being one of the six flag-raisers and organizing the raising of the second U.S. flag atop Mount Suribachi on February 23, 1945 as captured in the iconic photograph by AP photographer Joe Rosenthal. 
